Dear Mr. Chairman:


The investment put forth by the Department of Defense in the President's Budget Request for Fiscal Year (FY) 2026 assists in advancing U.S. Indo-Pacific Command's (USINDOPACOM) comparative military advantages in key warfighting capabilities and facilitates posture improvements contributing to reviving our warrior ethos and rebuilding our military. However, unless accelerated, security remains at risk.

In accordance with 10 U.S.C. 222a, I am enclosing my unfunded priorities report of joint initiatives which is aligned to the interim National Defense Strategy, and focused on immediate warfighting requirements that will provide tangible advantages while delivering deterrence.

The requirements listed in the enclosures are included within my Independent Assessment (Sec 1313 Report) and directly contribute to the Department's implementation guidance and USINDOPACOM's *Prevail* strategic approach, strengthening deterrence and providing increased stability with an appropriately postured joint force capable of rapidly transitioning from competition to crisis, and prevailing in conflict if deterrence fails. Continued investment in these capabilities would ensure U.S. forces present a persistent, lethal, and integrated joint force that can impose out-of-proportion costs and complicate any adversary's ability to effectively compete with the U.S. militarily while simultaneously demonstrating U.S. commitment and resolve to our allies and partners.

Identical letters have been provided to the Chairmen and Ranking Members of the other Defense Oversight Committees. Thank you for your consideration and continued support for USINDOPACOM, our service members, and their families.
