

USCENTCOM Operations FY 2026 Cost Updates (September 3, 2026)

- The Department continues to collect costs associated with the conflict in Iran which began as Operation EPIC FURY on February 28, 2026, including damage to U.S. military assets and infrastructure sustained during operations.
- As of September 3, 2026, the Department has (1) obligated ~\$11.2B for incremental costs associated with these operations, (2) estimated \$28.1B to replace expended munitions, and (3) estimated \$4.3B to replace equipment losses. Costs for equipment losses will continue to adjust as assessments are completed.
- The breakdown for the **\$43.6B** reported as of September 3, 2026, includes:
